

# FLTF Informational Webinar Recap April 23, 2025

This recaps the FLTF informational webinar held Wednesday, April 23, 2025. As the primary audience for our updates are property owners on Second and Smallwood, this will be our focus. We encourage you to listen to the entire 2-hour webinar, which included a lengthy Q&A session here

Construction was forced to halt due to numerous HCA legal actions. All have been reviewed and either denied or dismissed by the various Courts and Judges engaged.

Construction was suspended on Secord and Smallwood in summer of 2024 as each project completed a stage that allowed the dam to safely be suspended as there was uncertainty when construction could restart.

# **Current Situation**

- With HCA legal action denied by the Courts, FLTF can now issue bonds to continue construction.
- FLTF plans to issue two bonds, one in summer 2025 for \$80 million and then in 2026 for the balance of the funds required to complete the project. Unfortunately, bond market rates are higher than last year.
- The Cost of Delay is projected to remain in the \$10 million to \$20 million range.
- FLTF is working with Fisher Construction to mobilize equipment and crews back to Secord and Smallwood in May with the goal to restart work in June 2025.

In the following sections we will cover TIMING, COSTS, and ASSESSMENTS. We will then wrap up with Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's).

#### **TIMING**

Recall before the HCA suspension, both Secord and Smallwood were scheduled for completion with full legal

\*\*The <u>estimated</u> delay for both Secord and Smallwood is 12 to 15+ months. We will provide a table showing how long it will take to fill each lake depending on the time of year in the FAQ section.


EGLE will not allow a lake to fill in the Oct -Feb period due to wildlife hibernation and to avoid ice damage to boat lifts, docks, and seawalls. There were questions regarding Sanford Lake. As mentioned numerous times over the past 14 months, construction was required to be suspended when a dam was at a phase that allowed construction to safely stop.

The Secord dam suspended after the embankment and axillary spillway were competed to allow water to exit the lake via the temporary gap in the axillary spillway. When the coffer dam was installed to protect the primary spillway, Secord was approved by EGLE to safely suspend.

Work on Sanford dam continued to complete the construction phases required to safely suspend. As this work was recently completed, the crew from Spence Brothers had not fully removed equipment or personnel from the site. Hence, Sanford should not have the same level of delay costs as the other 3 dams. This represents savings to all in the FLSAD. The schedule for Sanford dam has not been impacted by the HCA delay to the same degree as Secord, Smallwood and Edenville.

# **COSTS - - Construction**

FLTF indicates the estimated cost of delay due to the HCA suspension will be in the range of \$10 million to \$20 million. FLTF indicates the cost of the project is still estimated to be within the NOT TO EXCEED capital assessment approved by the Counties in February 2024.



In February 2024, the Counties approved the NOT TO EXCEED capital assessment (Line A) which represented a contingency over the Dec 2023 estimate (Line B). The planning contingency was \$34.5 million (Line E). The Dec 2023 estimate included the bids for Secord, Smallwood, and Sanford along with an estimate for Edenville.

In March 2024, FLTF updated the cost estimate after receiving the Edenville bid which was lower than the estimate used in Dec '24 (Line C). Had the project not been suspended, this likely would have been the number used to establish capital assessments representing a reduction of \$45.2 million vs the NOT TO EXCEED assessment (Line A minus Line C). In other words, a reduction or savings for ALL property owners in the FLSAD.

When we look at the April 2025 estimate (Line D) it is below the NOT TO EXCEED assessment (Line A). The current estimated Cost of Delay is Line F (Line D minus Line C). This number is subject to change.

# **COSTS – Operations and Maintenance**

FLTF indicates this remains unchanged with the assessment approved by the Counties in February 2024 for the next 5 years (2025 to 2029).

#### **ASSESSMENT**

The approved **Operations and Maintenance** assessment will appear on the Winter (December) 2025 tax bill due in February 2026. This assessment is approved and set for the next 5 years. The Operations and Maintenance assessment **cannot** be increased annually as claimed by some on Facebook.

Due to the 2025 bond issuance of \$80 million, a modified **Capital** assessment will appear on the Winter (December 2025) tax bill due in February 2026. This amount will be approximately 60% (or 40% less) of the NOT TO EXCEED assessment approved. The NOT TO EXCEED amount is shown on the FLTF assessment map.

The issuance of the second bond will occur in 2026. On the Winter (December) 2026 tax bill due in February 2027 the full annual capital assessment will be due. This should be based on a final cost computation rather than estimates and cannot be greater than the NOT TO EXCEED capital assessment approved in Feb 2024. The capital assessment **cannot** be increased annually as claimed by some on Facebook.

There are options to pay off the capital assessment at any time either partially or in full. There is an option to pay the entire capital assessment by July 1, 2025, to avoid any interest. FLTF will be mailing a letter to each property owner of record in early May to explain in detail the capital assessment and options available for payment.


This FLTF chart outlines the next steps regarding financing for property owners.

# FREQUENTY ASKED QUESTIONS

# Q1: How long will it take a specific lake to refill realizing EGLE will not allow a lake to fill in the October to February timeframe?

Let us review the table FLTF provided in 2023 addressing this question:



#### Q2: Will Secord, Smallwood, and Sanford fill before Wixom?

YES, each lake can fill when construction is complete, and a fill permit issued by EGLE.

# Q3: If a property owner pays the capital assessment in full, and for any reason the total project cost is lower, will a rebate be issued for the difference?

YES. If the total capital assessment amount is lowered, and one paid in full, a rebate will be issued to the property owner of record at the time of the rebate. FLTF will provide more details in the May mailing.

#### Q4: Can the assessment increase up to 10% annually as some on Facebook claim?

NO. Once the Capital assessment is established it remains as approved. It cannot be increased annually. The Operations and Maintenance assessment is approved for the next 5 years. It cannot be automatically increased annually. It can be modified in the next approval process by the Counties for Winter tax bill 2030.

#### Q5: How do I learn more about the Capital Assessment and payment options?

#### Q6: Why did FLTF not suspend work on Sanford?

Work at Sanford was scheduled to be suspended with the phase recently completed. With the MI Supreme Court ruling, work can continue and there is no reason for Spence Brothers to remove their equipment or crew from the work site. There will be limited costs to redeploy equipment and crews at Sanford. Unfortunately, the other three dam construction sites will have costs to redeploy equipment and crews.

## Q7: What work is required to be completed at Secord dam?

EGLE has described Secord as requiring three significant work phases: 1) Enforcement of the Embankment, 2) the Axillary Spillway and 3) the Primary Spillway and Gates.

The Embankment and Axillary Spillway phases are complete.

Our "Facebook engineers" indicate all that is needed is to hang the new gates. Not the case.

The Primary Spillway currently has a coffer dam around it. That concrete spillway requires significant work to bring it to safety standards and to allow the new gates to be installed. This work is complicated by the coffer dam holding back the Secord Lake impoundment. There is a smaller footprint for crews and equipment to work resulting in more time required to complete the primary spillway work. There are also safety hazards for the crew that may slow down their work.

Conversely, similar primary spillway work at Sanford and Edenville is easier and less costly to complete as there is no lake impoundment to hold back resulting in a larger work area. Crews have more flexibility to work.

### Q8: Is FLTF continuing to seek grants to reduce the cost to all property owners?

YES. As mentioned, several times over the past year, it is easier to receive grants when there is no encumbrance with court challenges. Unfortunately, the past year was difficult for this reason.

FLTF was denied grants from the MI DNR Fisheries; EGLE Dam Risk Reduction and Consumers Energy Citizen Planet.

Several federal government grants applied for and anticipated are no longer available.

FLTF **secured** a \$1.4 million grant for High Hazard Potential Dams from FEMA.

Members of the Secord Lake Association are actively engaged with FLTF to seek grants and will continue our efforts to help FLTF secure support to reduce assessment costs for ALL property owners in the FLSAD.

#### Q9: What is the anticipated bond interest rate?

The market has more volatility today than a year ago. FLTF anticipates rates between 5-6% with a not-to-exceed rate of 6.6%. The rate on the first bond of \$80 million will be known around May 20, 2025. The rate on the second bind will be determined at the time it is issued sometime next year.

#### Q10: Is there State Grant money available to complete the projects?

NO. There is no grant money beyond what is already considered in the computation of cost, based on the \$200 Million received in 2022. FLTF indicates there is about \$24 million remaining from the state grant, with a plan to spend the remainder of funds prior to the September 2026 grant expiration date.
